There will be NO PRESCHOOL on Monday, January 21<sup>st</sup> in honor of Martin Luther King, Jr. Day.

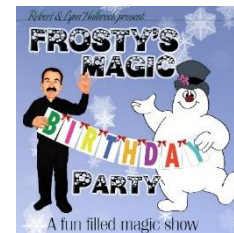
### FAMILY EVENT

## KINDERGARTEN

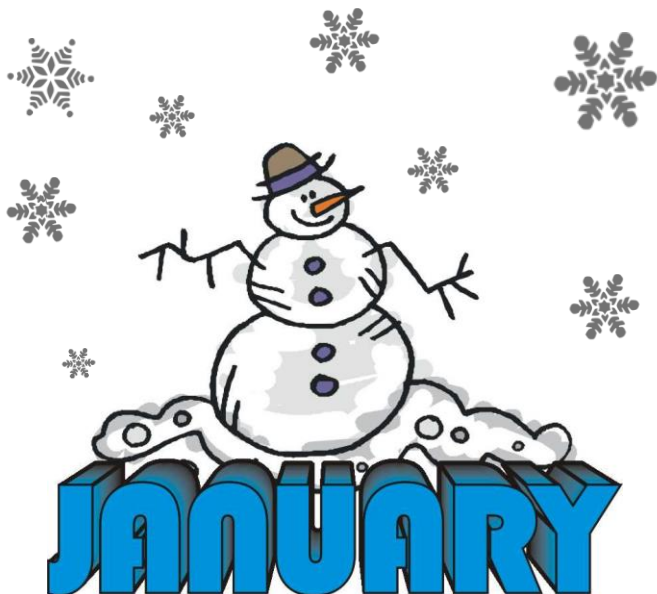
Kindergarten registration for all schools in District 197 is **January 17<sup>th</sup>**. For more information please go to the following web page on the District 197 website:
